Esther – A Semi-Staged Musical Cantata by Paul J Burrell

Synopsis

Xerxes is King of the massive Persian Empire and he wants people to know it! In order to display his power to the world, he holds a celebration in honour of himself which culminates in a great banquet. Here he summons his wife, Vashti, who refuses to come just to show her beauty to the King's nobles and Lords. The King (greatly embarrassed by such wilful disobedience) is advised to banish her since she may set a bad example to other women. This he does, but after a short time he becomes lovesick and decides to find another wife (by audition).

Esther, whose parents have died, is being looked after by her cousin Mordecai. He urges her to go to the palace in the hope that she might be chosen. Out of thousands of girls, finally King Xerxes chooses Esther. Shortly afterwards Mordecai foils a plot to kill Xerxes. This is recorded in the King's chronicles.

Meanwhile an ambitious tyrant, Haman, has gained rapid promotion. He wants people to know his new-found authority and requires everyone to bow down worshipfully as he passes. Mordecai refuses. When Haman discovers this he becomes intent, not only on destroying Mordecai but also the whole of his race, the Jews. Haman casts lots (Purim) to decide on which day the mass murder will take place.

When Mordecai discovers this plan he writes to Queen Esther stating that she is the one who must plead to the King for her people. Esther has not been invited to be in the King's presence for a whole month. She risks her own life in going to see the King since it is a capital offence to approach his inner chamber without first being called. Thankfully Xerxes is so pleased to see her that he offers her up to half his Kingdom. All she asks is that both Haman and the King come for a meal with her that very evening. The King agrees. Haman boasts ecstatically about this privilege to his wife (Zeresh) and his friends. Later at the meal Esther's only request is that they meet together again the following night. As Haman leaves he notes that Mordecai still does not bow down to him, and on the advice of his wife, builds a gallows for him.

That evening the King cannot sleep. He commands that the Chronicles of his reign be read out. When he hears a section naming Mordecai as the one who saved him from treason he discovers that nothing has been done to reward him. Xerxes insists that the matter be set to rights and enquires as to who is in the court. Haman has just arrived to request the death of Mordecai on his newly built gallows. Haman presumes that he is the one to be honoured but is devastated to find that it is Mordecai. Haman is commanded by the King to lead Mordecai through the streets and to proclaim his great honour!

Things get even worse for Haman when, at that evening's meal Esther reveals that he seeks to destroy all the Jewish people. The King is furious and temporarily leaves the room. Haman had not realised Esther was Jewish and tries to retrieve the situation by pleading vigorously and holding on to her. When the King returns he clearly thinks that Haman is up to something else! Haman is sent to hang on the gallows he had prepared for Mordecai. Mordecai himself is given Haman's position and possessions.

Since Haman's decree had the King's signature, it is irrevocable. Xerxes gives Esther and Mordecai permission to issue another edict allowing the Jews to defend themselves against all aggression. This they do successfully throughout the Empire. At the end they hold a great feast known as Purim to commemorate their victory and the triumph of good over evil.

The Palace – beautifully decorated

Memucan

The feast we arranged was out of this world. He expected something special. What he got was truly spectacular and it was not going to be just one night either. We'd had months of one banquet after another, sightseeing trips to the King's great achievementstown planning, architecture, water drainage (what a bore!)but this celebration was to go on for a week, then after a couple of days, wine and dancing, the King suddenly remembered something.

A great feast with music, dance and entertainers

Xerxes

Well this must be the best thing that's happened in years. The idea of celebrating me for week upon week was absolutely first rate. I wish I'd thought of it myself..... or perhaps I did!but I mustn't let people get boredjust a minuteVashti.....my wife Vashti.....I'll show them Vashti. She's so pretty (if I remember rightly). They can admire her features. She could dance or jiggle around a bit – that would be nice. I must send for her right awayshe's entertaining the ladies somewhere or other – Harbonaoff you gobring Queen Vashti here as soon as you can. Say 'the King asksno change that. Say 'the King requires you to attend him, and his Lords at the great banquet'. (Harbona tries to leave)and by the way, tell her to wear that nice silk number I got for her last week.

Scene 2b

Stage left – subtle lighting. Two aristocratic women are talking with Queen Vashti

Harbona 'Queen Vashti'

Vashti "Yes, Harbona can't you see I'm deep in conversation".

Harbona "Queen Vashti, the King requires you to attend him at the great banquet

(Vashti mimics him)

Vashti "Harbona, tell him I'm really rather busy at the moment"

Harbona "Forgive me, my lady but he would like to ershow you to his nobles and his

lords"

Vashti "I beg your pardon, you little Enoch (or is it Eunuch, I can't remember).

You must say to him I'm ratheroccupied".

Harbona "O, my lady, forgive me, I think it is important".

Vashti "Harbona, are you trying to tell me what to do?"

Harbona "No, my lady, but the King"

Vashti "The King, Harbona, must wait for a long time. Tell him I am not his

candlestick...... am not his Barbie doll"

Harbona (Pause) "Does that mean you won't be coming then?"

Vashti "I think it is safe to assume that, Harbonagoodbye".

Xerxes (Holds up his hand) "Stop - everyone stop - I have something very, very

important, very special to bring to your attention. Harbona, tell us your good news".

Harbona "The Queen, your majesty, she said, she sort of implied"

Xerxes "Come on man, out with it!"

Harbona "The Queen, my Lord, saidshe will not come. She said.....No".

ALL "No?"

Memucan

So that was itshe may have been pretty, but reallyshe just had to go. You may think this is a little harsh, but as I pointed out to the King.....if she gets away with this – life would become unbearable for him and for all of us with wives. You know what it's like. Every time they disobey their husbands they would say (high squeaky voice) "Queen Vashti did it". No we couldn't have that. On our advice – he packed her off the next morning, gave her a fuel injection camel, some leftover food (very generous, I thought) and away she zoomed into the desert.

But would you believe it – even after that great feast

Xerxes (lovesick voice) "I'm missing her".

Memucan "But my Lord, we **can't** allow her back".

Xerxes "I know, I know, and it's all my fault. Women are just so nice to have

around.....every now and then".

Memucan "Well there must be someone else. (Snaps fingers) Hey, great idea. We should

audition for a new wife".

Xerxes "Audition? I'm a King, not a musical!"

Memucan "We can put the ads in every town in every province - Are you attractive, charming,

obedient? Then (RAP) Change your life to become a wife. You can meet the King all

you do is ring0800 100 100

Xerxes "Memucan, freephones haven't been invented yet".

Memucan "OK, but they **could** all come to the palace couldn't they.

Xerxes "Well, you organise it – but in the end this will have to be my decision, is that clear?"

Scene 3b A modestly furnished room. Esther is busy.

Mordecai "Esther, Esther, have you heard the news......King Xerxes is advertising for a new

wife....and I've just been thinking....

Esther

"Mordecai, of course I've heard the news, all those crazy girls down the street are getting excited about it, but not me.....I'm happy as I am. Who needs a King when I can look after you, my favourite cousin. (*Puts her arms round him*). At least you're not going to throw me outare you? In any case I'm not going to parade my body like at somecamel market and look, do you really think these hands are the hands of a Queen?"

Mordecai

"Listen Esther, listen to me. You're more than a Queen. If it's the right thing to do, you will succeed. If it isn't, then all you lose is a little pride. A long time ago our forefather, Abraham, was told he would have many, many descendants – he saw the stars in the desert night sky and God told him "Your children will be as many as those stars"...

Esther

(Laughs) "Mordecai, I really don't want any children yet".

Mordecai

"Yes but just let me finish, Abraham was very old and even his wife Sarah was 90. How on earth could they have children? And yethe believed God and left it in God's hands. Esther, believe me. Go to the King's palace. Don't tell them you're a Jew. Who knows, it may be that God has some special plan for you".

(Song – The Promise)

Esther

"Mordecai, you have a way with words pray for me".

Mordecai

(Pause) "The Lord bless you".

THE PROMISE

Mordecai solo and all chorus

(Starlight effects)

"Girls, girls and yet more girls. They came in droves. Some longed to come, some were dragged. Some were plainly pretty. Some were pretty plain. After a month of one girl after another it all began to get to me. One night I had a dream I was doing the auditions ... and when I woke up ... I was!"

Then after one year we got down to the twelve finalists. They were all given special beauty treatment.

"But only one girl stood out in my mind, and for the most curious reasons. She did not have a 'made-up' pretty face – though she was very attractive. She was intelligent, witty, knowledgeable good company.... and above all, natural. The others were lovely but also desperate to succeed. She was just herself, the only one who seemed to know the decision was not in her hands. We really liked her and what is more importantso did the King. Her name was Hadassah or Esther as we called her. Apparently she had been brought up by her older cousin Mordecai because her parents had died. Whatever she felt about the whole thing I'll never know".

(Esther song – Real in my Life)

Mordecai

(Writing) Dearest Esther, I know your heart must be playing tricks with you, I understand you must have mixed feelings, but I really thought it was right for you to go to the palace last year. Somehow there must be an inner purpose in all this. I am writing to tell you something very important. I have been working at the King's gate, as you know, and I overheard a conversation between two men, Bigthan and Teresh, who were really angry because they were overlooked for promotion and their advice ignored.

Spotlight stage right

Esther

(Continuing reading)....they are full of deep hatred and are plotting to kill the King and seize power. Esther, you must tell the King about this.

The Palace

Xerxes

Well.....there it is. A new wife, a new start....and I was so grateful to Esther and Mordecai for passing on that information. Mordecai must be rewarded some day, but first to more important things. We have got into a bit of a muddle of late, what with weddings and the like. I need a Levelling Down campaign —a cabinet reshuffle perhaps. One man has started to catch my eye, a Junior Minister called Haman. True, he is a bit pushy and a touch arrogant, but he that might be the type to get things done.

Scene 5b - The home of Haman and Zeresh - fairly wealthy

Zeresh

"Haman, **do** come away from the mirror darling".

Haman

(Looking in a mirror) "Oh Zeresh, I'm so fed up of being just one more civil servant. Everyone else seems so mediocre and I've tried **every** trick in the trade to get myself noticed. If the King wants to go for the real talent why settle for second best when he can have me. Zeresh, how do I get rid of this stupid spot on my nose?

Zeresh

"I hope it will happen soon. We've been in this poky little mansion for too long. Did you send the King those Egyptian spices he likes?"

Haman

"Ow! Yes, and I was the only one who could get them. I'm sure he'll appreciate that ... **out** damned spot".

Zeresh

"The old fool might come to his senses before long so we'd better keep trying. This is all proving very expensive but, if you succeed – who knows where it will endHaman! Hurry up, why don't you just squeeze it?

Haman

(Oblivious) "Well.....nothing ventured......nothing gained. Ow!

(Haman & Zeresh – Song – The Palms of our Hands)

Haman and Zeresh (solos) + All Chorus (2 parts)

Haman Living life in mediocrity

As the days just pass me by

Suddenly - there it was. I could hardly believe it. I was appointed to be second in command to the King himself. Oh, I deserved it, I know....but so quickly? I had to let people know my new position, so I thought of a wonderful idea. Everyone must bow whenever I pass by, and not just a casual nod of the head......more of a worshipful sort of bow. I had the King's backing, of course, not that the old man cared one way or the otherBUT, unfortunately, it was brought to my attention that one obnoxious man would not so much as bend the knee when I passed by. I really had to see it to believe it! There he was standing straight-backed and defiant while everyone else grovelled at mv feet. What was his name?.....Mordecai. (Haman stands abruptly). But hear this. I have just learned that this Mordecai is a Jew. You'd better understand that my race, the Amalekites, have had bitter wars with the Jews. So now, I am powerful and I could have him killed of course, but I want to set the records straight. I shall punish not only this Mordecai but the whole of his stupid race. He has wounded my pride but now I am glad......because they shall all suffer. (Music under) but I must choose the right day. I shall cast PURIM, the lots to decide on which day they must be killed. May the gods help me to bring complete destruction on them all. I will bribe the King with silver and use his signet ring to carry out this complete and pleasurable, this bitter sweet extermination. It must be published in every province so that none of them survives. If it's the last thing I do, they shall die, every one of them, Mordecai and his people. How dare they? (Dark music - sorrowful strings).

Front stage right - isolated

Mordecai

(*Prayerfully*) "Oh my God, forgive my pride if I have done wrongbut how, my God, could I bow and worship anyone but you. Lord, hear us as we cry to you. We are so weak and helpless, but you are stronger than any man.

Abraham, Moses, Joseph, Samuel, David, Elijah. All cried out to you in their time. They all needed you, they all believed in you and Lord, in all my weakness.....so do I.

(Song – Stronger than this)

STRONGER THAN THIS

Sung by Chorus of Jews - defiantly

All V1 Haman loves to play to the gallery

(Holds letter from Mordecai) - From Mordecai? (PauseSmile turns to sadness.....looks up) But why? Why this terrible, brutal act against my people. (Reads) Haman will pay 10,000 pieces of silver to King Xerxes when he has carried out this murder. "Esther, you must go to the King and plead with him for the lives of our people." (She pauses and writes)

Mordecai

(He holds the letter and reads...) "Dear Mordecai, you know that I respect you more than anyone and you know that I love my people but do you understand what you are asking of me? There is a law within this palace I thought you knew – anyone, including myself, Queen Esther, who enters the King's inner court, without first being invited and called, shall be put to death – unless by chance King Xerxes should hold out his golden sceptre. Mordecai, I am also afraid that the King has lost interest in me. I have not been called to see him for a whole month. I really do not know what influence I can have now." (He becomes tense and writes)

Esther

...(Holds letter, looks up) From Mordecai...... I hope he understands (reads...) "Esther, do not think that because you are now rich and in the King's palace that you will escape death any more than the rest of us. You must not keep silent at this time. God could choose anyone to save us, and you are in a position of privilege. Who knows, but that God has put you there for such a time as this. I understand your fears and that your very life is on the line but please, Esther, do not turn your face away from God and from your people. It is better to die with honour than to live with disgrace" (writes...)

Mordecai

(**Reads...**) "Then please, please ask **all** the people to pray for me for three days and three nights. I understand what you are saying! will go to the King ...

(very slowly)

"and if I liveI live......and if I must dieI must die......Oh my God I want to be in your armsI want to believe your promises. Please ... help me now.

(Song – In Your Arms)

Palace outer court

Harbona

I saw Queen Esther in the palace for the first time in a month. I had no idea why she had come. She looked as beautiful as ever but she also appeared very solemn. I could hardly believe it as she went towards the King's inner court. She knew the rules of the palace. I had to say to her "Queen Esther, I beg you, do not think of entering the King's court. You cannot take your life in your own hands in this way". I will never forget her reply. Slowly she said

Esther

"My life is not in my hands".

Esther 'parts the purple curtains' to the inner court where the King and his commanders are in deep conversation. It is clearly an important discussion. Harbona looks through a small slit in the curtains as Esther moves towards the King. It is as if the whole world stops and balances on the point of a sword. Here life and death are face to face. The King turns and shudders at the sight of Esther. He is clearly shocked. Esther faces death. There is a pause.

In an instant the King grasps his golden sceptre and holds it out towards Esther. She is pardoned.

Xerxes

"Queen Esther, I have not seen you for such a long time. (Aside) Gentlemen forgive this interruption in our conversation. Esther, ask for anythingeven up to half my Kingdom.

Esther

"My Lord, I would not presume to ask for that. If it seems good to you, please come to dinner with me tonight, and sir, if it seems good to you to grant this request, I would be pleased if you could bring Haman with you.

Xerxes

"Esther, that's an excellent idea. We shall both be there".

Scene 8b

Haman's home – much more luxurious than before. Haman arrives. His wife and friends are gathered. *Zeresh boasts of Haman, her children, and everything in sight!*

Haman (Whistles and sings 'we will build a palace of gold') Hello there, anybody home?
